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SCOPE OF WORK

Description of Services

OHA is in need of contractor(s) to auction off vehicles from the Authority's fleet. The Authority maintains a fleet of approximately 160 vehicles. This includes sedans, pickup trucks, utility vehicles, and both cargo and passenger vans. Listed below are the numbers of vehicles sold and the total sales amounts for the last three (3) years:

Year	Vehicles Sold	Sales Amount
2017	9	\$21,585.00
2018	5	\$3,442.00
2019	6	\$4,284.00

Contractors shall provide appraisal and consulting services; marketing and advertising; vehicle transportation, storage and preparation, and after-sale administration. The successful contractor(s) shall manage the marketing of the OHA's vehicles to maximize residual values and demonstrate the ability to reach markets for specialty vehicles.

Contractor shall provide the following services:

- 1. Contractor shall conduct vehicle auction by live and competitive bidding for each vehicle offered for sale by OHA.
- 2. The contractor shall perform a safety inspection on the vehicles to be auctioned if the OHA has not performed safety inspection.
- 3. Contractor shall, at a minimum, auction OHA vehicles monthly or within 45 days of when vehicle is made available to Contractor.
- 4. Contractor's Staff:
 - a. Contractor shall provide sufficient staff to each auction so that the sale is professionally executed.
 - b. Contractor shall provide a dedicated competent account manager who shall be responsible for the OHA account.
 - c. Contractor shall provide appropriate personnel to inspect and advise on "looting" of vehicles prior to cataloguing, market valuation, presentation and advertising.
- 5. Storage and Transportation of Auction Vehicles
 - a. Contractor shall have tow trucks and flatbeds to be used in transporting the auction vehicles.
 - Contractor shall ensure that OHA property stored at the auction facility is secured and protected from damage or vandalism. If a lot

does not sell during an auction, the Contractor shall store it, free of charge until, the next scheduled auction. No storage charges will apply unless OHA staff request extended storage beyond the date of the next scheduled auction.

- c. When OHA requests the contractor to pick-up and transport vehicles from OHA owned or operated sites to the auction site, the Contractor shall be financially responsible for each vehicle from the point the vehicles are picked up. When OHA has other transportation for the vehicles, the Contractor shall be financially responsible for each vehicle from the point they are delivered to their auction site.
- d. Contractor shall not use OHA property for any purpose other than in the performance of its obligations under the agreement

6. Auction Requirements

- a. Contractor shall be responsible for all costs associated with cataloguing, advertising and marketing. Contractor shall have prominent advertising in local newspapers, on the public Internet, direct mail advertisements, or other medium acceptable to OHA.
- b. Each vehicle shall be digitally photographed by the Contractor. Digital file shall be made available to OHA at settlement.
- c. Contractor shall post auction items online and have advertisements in public circulation at a minimum of seven days prior to the date of auction and shall provide OHA copies of said advertisements. This advertising effort shall be conducted in the following formats:
 - Direct mailing to the Contractor's active and prospective bidders (or e-mail announcements for Internet-based auctions.)
 - 2) Auction announcements posted on the Contractor's auction internet website.
 - 3) At a minimum, this advertising shall announce the date, place and time of the auction, and that the auction includes vehicles and equipment being sold on behalf of the OHA.
- d. All vehicles listed for auction shall include the following information:
 - 1) Make and Model;
 - 2) Model Year;
 - 3) Odometer;
 - 4) Vehicle Identification Number (VIN); and
 - 5) Photos.
- 7. Contractor shall accept reserve or minimum bid prices on individual vehicles from OHA. OHA reserves the right, at any time before a sale, to withdraw any lot or individual vehicle without cause and without penalty except for reimbursement to the Contractor for direct out-of-pocket expenses.
- 8. OHA shall be allowed on-site access to each auction to observe and monitor the conformities and performances of Contractor.
- 9. Contractor shall solicit the highest bid and only accept the most favorable and responsible offer.
- 10. Contractor shall utilize a computerized system to register bidders, generate sales receipts, and provide reports as required regarding the sale/payment status of any and all vehicles.

- a. Contractor shall record each successful bidder's name, company name, address, telephone number and bidder number and shall provide this list to the OHA at settlement in an acceptable electronic format.
- b. Contractor shall provide each successful bidder a computerized receipt immediately after payment, with the following information:
 - 1) Bidder's name;
 - 2) Company name, address, telephone number;
 - 3) Bidder number;
 - 4) Vehicle VIN number;
 - 5) Year, make, model;
 - 6) Odometer:
 - 7) Auction lot number; and
 - 8) Sale price.
- c. Contractor shall provide reports of all vehicle sale details by date as requested by OHA.
- 11. Contractor shall be responsible to complete the title transfer, properly notarize the title, and present the title to the buyer upon receiving full payment.
- 12. Contractor shall be responsible for preparing and submitting a "Release of Liability" form for each vehicle, immediately upon sale.
- 13. Contractor shall be responsible for the collection of all monies and shall not add any additional surcharges or fees of any kind without the prior consent of OHA. Any additional charges or fees to OHA shall be reviewed by OHA for approval.
- 14. Contractor shall bear or collect any applicable sales taxes and fees from the buyer. Contractor shall comply with all state, federal and local laws and regulations as they pertain to the sales of the property.
- 15. Contractor shall pay OHA, within 30 days of auction, the net sale amount of all purchases.
- 16. If requested by OHA, Contractor shall provide the OHA with access to copies of all its records pertaining or relating to OHA transactions for auditing purposes.
- 17. OHA, on occasions, will require electronic title search, duplicating title, vehicle reconditioning and other services from the Contractor.
- 18. Employees, officers, and agents of the Contractor shall not be authorized to bid on OHA's property when it is auctioned.

PROCEDURE: Bidders must submit proposed pricing where provided for on the Request for Quote form.
HA = Housing Authority

- 1.0 HA CONTACT: All questions pertaining this quote shall be addressed to the person indicated on the Quote form.
- APPLICABILITY: By submitting a quote (hereinafter referred to as "bid") to our HA, the firm or individual doing so (hereinafter, "the bidder") is automatically agreeing to abide by all terms and conditions listed herein, including those terms and conditions within the HUD document, form HUD-5370-EZ (1/2014), General Contract Conditions for Small Construction/Development Contracts, which will be included in the Purchase Order if selected and may be provided if requested. For non-construction, by submitting a quote (hereinafter referred to as "bid") to our HA, the firm or individual doing so (hereinafter, "the bidder") is automatically agreeing to abide by all terms and conditions listed herein, including those terms and conditions within the HUD document, Table 5.1, Mandatory Contract Clauses for Small Purchases Other Than Construction, which will be included in the Purchase Order if selected and may be provided if requested.
- 3.0 HA RESERVATION OF RIGHTS: The HA reserves the right to:
 - Reject any or all bids, to waive any informalities in the Solicitation process, or to terminate the Solicitation process at any time, if deemed by the HA to be in the best interest of the HA;
 - 3.2 Terminate a contract awarded pursuant to this Solicitation at any time for its convenience upon delivery of a 10-day written notice to the apparent or successful bidder;
 - 3.3 Determine the days, hours and locations that the successful bidder shall provide the items or services called for in this Solicitation.
 - Reject and not consider any bid that does not, in the opinion of the HA Buyer, meet the requirements of this Solicitation, including but not necessarily limited to incomplete bids and/or bids offering alternate (not including "or equal" items) or non-requested items or services;
 - For non-construction related work, negotiate the amount that is paid to or by the successful bidder, meaning the amount quoted by the apparent successful bidder may, at the HA's desecration, be the basis for the beginning of negotiations.
- 4.0 BIDDER'S RESPONSIBILITY: Each bidder must carefully review and comply with all instructions provided herein, provided within any named attachments and those provided within the Request for Quote Form.
- 5.0 DEADLINE: Each bidder shall submit his/her proposed costs, prior to the posted deadline, where provided within the form. Whereas this is an informal solicitation process, the HA reserves the right to extend the posted deadline at any time prior to the deadline, if, in the opinion of the HA Buyer, it is in the best interests of the HA to do so.
- 6.0 HOLD PRICES/NON-ESCALATION: By submitting a bid, each bidder thereby agrees to "hold" or not increase the proposed bid prices for the contract period if selected, with no escalation. If quantities are listed, they are for the purpose of determining best pricing per line item.
- 7.0 PURCHASE ORDER (PO): The HA will procure the applicable goods or services by issuance of a PO (which shall have the same meaning as a "contract"). PO's will be issued on an as-needed basis only. By submitting a bid, the successful bidder thereby agrees to confirm receipt of the PO in the manner directed by the HA.
- AWARD CRITERIA: If an award is completed pursuant to this Solicitation, and unless otherwise instructed by the HA, award shall be made to the responsive and responsible bidder that submits the lowest cost. For non-construction, if an award is completed pursuant to this Solicitation, and unless otherwise instructed by the HA, award shall be made to the responsive and responsible bidder that submits the lowest cost (as detailed within 8.1 8.2 following). However, unless otherwise stated, the HA reserves the right to (in addition to the Reservation of Rights Notice, Section 3.0 of this document):
 - 8.1 To make award to the same bidder (aggregate) for all items; or,
 - 8.2 To make award to multiple bidders for the same or different items.
- 9.0 INVALID OR ALTERNATE BIDS: Failure to complete and submit all required information, or to add any additional requirements not acceptable to the HA, may invalidate the bid submitted. Furthermore, the HA shall reserve the right to reject, without consideration, alternate bids, meaning those that do not meet the requirements of this Solicitation. PLEASE NOTE: An allowed "or equal" bid does not constitute an "alternate" bid—"or equal" means that the proposed "equal" item is substantially "equal" to the item specified by the HA.
- 10.0 BID COSTS: There shall be no obligation for the HA to compensate any bidder or prospective bidder for any costs that he/she may incur in responding to this Solicitation.
- 11.0 SHIPPING COSTS: Each bid sum submitted shall include delivery of the items to the specified HA site or location, as specified within the Solicitation or on the PO issued.
- 12.0 ASSIGNMENT OF PERSONNEL: The HA shall retain the right to demand and receive a change in personnel assigned by the successful bidder to provide services to the HA if the HA believes that such change is in the best interest of the HA and the completion of the work or provision of the items.
- 13.0 UNAUTHORIZED SUB-CONTRACTING PROHIBITED: The successful bidder shall not assign any right, nor delegate any duty for the work proposed pursuant to this Solicitation (including, but not limited to, selling or transferring the ensuing PO or contract)

without the prior written consent of the HA Buyer. Any purported assignment of interest or delegation of duty, without the prior written consent of the HA Buyer shall be void and may result in the cancellation of the PO or contract with the HA.

- 14.0 LICENSING AND INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS: By submitting a bid the successful bidder thereby certifies that he/she possess and will, upon request by the HA, present to the HA, proof and/certification of the following:

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Consultant/Contractor/Organization shall procure and maintain for the duration of the Contract insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work hereunder by the Consultant/Contractor/Organizer, its agents, representatives, or employees.

Minimum Scope of Insurance

Coverage shall be as least as board as:

- 1. Insurance Services Office Commercial General Liability coverage (occurrence Form CG 0001).
- 2. Insurance Services Office Form Number CA 0001 covering Automobile Liability, Code 1 (any auto).
- 3. Workers' Compensation insurance as required by the State of California and Employer's Liability Insurance.
- 4. Errors and Omissions Liability insurance appropriate to the consultant's profession. Architects' and engineers' coverage is to be endorsed to include contractual liability.
- 5. Fidelity Bond appropriate to the on/off site personnel coverage is to be endorsed to include indemnification from misconduct and dishonesty of contractor's/consultant's personnel.
- **6. Cyber Security Insurance coverage** is to be endorsed to include indemnification from breach of contract and unauthorized client data access.
- 7. **Professional Liability Coverage** is to be endorsed to include indemnification from misleading or fraudulent acts.
- 8. Builders Risk Insurance as required by the State of California
- **9. Crane Physical Damage Insurance** as required by the State of California (Code Section 1763.1).
- 10. Pollution Insurance CalEPA standards of air emissions.
- **11. Garage Liability** as required by the Bureau of Automotive Repair of the State of California (BAR) to be endorsed for injury and property damaged.

Minimum Limits of Insurance

Consultant/Contractor/Organizers shall maintain limits no less than:

1. General Liability:

(Including operations, products and completed operations, as applicable.)

\$1,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage. If Commercial General Liability Insurance or other form with a general aggregate limit is used, either

the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this project/location or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit.

2. Automobile Liability:

\$1,000,000 per accident for bodily injury and

property damage.

4. Builders Risk Insurance:

\$1,000,000 per occurrence for direct physical

\$1,000,000 per occurrence to cover both 1st and 3rd party claims through the entire contract; \$200 per record per occurrence in the amount not to exceed the cost of the full contract. Provide identity theft product to effected entities for one (1) year.

9. Garage Liability

Garage insurance will consist of an employee dishonesty provision for theft or vandalism done by an employee to any Authority vehicle while in

the possession of the garage.

Deductible and Self-Insured Retentions

Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the Authority. At the option of the Authority; the insurer shall reduce or eliminate such deductibles or self-insured retentions as respects the Authority, its officers, officials, employees and volunteers; or the Consultant/Contractor/Organizers shall provide a

financial guarantee satisfactory to the Authority guaranteeing payment of losses and related investigations, claim administration and defense expenses.

Other Insurance Provisions

The commercial general liability is to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions.

- The Authority, its commissioners, members, officers, agents, employees and volunteers are to be covered as insureds as respects: liability arising out of work or operations performed by or on behalf of the Consultant/Contractor/Organizer; or automobiles owned, leased, hired or borrowed by the Consultant/Contractor/Organizer.
- 2. For any claims related to this project, the Consultant's/Contractor's/Organizer's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the Authority, its officers, officials, employees and volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the Authority, its commissioners, members, officers, agents, employees or volunteers shall be excess of the Consultant's/Contractor's/Organizer's insurance and shall not contribute with it.
- 3. Each insurance policy required by this clause shall be endorsed to state that coverage shall not be canceled by either party, except after (30) days' prior written notice by certified mail, returned receipt requested, has been given to the Authority.
- 4. Any failure to comply with reporting provisions of the policies shall not affect coverage provided to the Authority, its commissioners, members, officers, agents, employees and volunteers.
- 5. Coverage shall not extend to any indemnity coverage for the active negligence of the additional insured in any case where an agreement to indemnify the additional insured would be invalid under Subdivision (b) of Section 2782 of the Civil Code.

Acceptability of Insurers

Insurance is to be placed with insurers with a current A.M. Best's rating of no less than A:VI, unless otherwise acceptable to the Authority.

Verification of Coverage

Consultant/Contractor shall furnish the Authority with certificates of insurance and with original endorsements evidencing coverage required by this clause. All certificates and endorsements are to be received and approved by the Authority before work commences. The Authority reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all

required insurance policies, including endorsements affecting the coverage required by these specifications at any time.

*Oakland Housing Authority shall be named as an additionally insured on all policies, certificate of insurance and endorsements.

"Bona fide employee" means a person, employed by a bidder and subject to the bidder's supervision and control as to time, place, and manner of performance, who neither exerts, nor proposes to exert improper influence to solicit or obtain contracts nor holds out as being able to obtain any contract(s) through improper influence.

"Improper influence" means any influence that induces or tends to induce a PHA/IHA employee or officer to give consideration or to act regarding a PHA/IHA contract on any basis other than the merits of the matter.

- (b) The bidder represents and certifies as part of its bid that, except for full-time bona fide employees working solely for the bidder, the bidder:
- (1) [] has, [] has not employed or retained any person or company to solicit or obtain this contract; and
- (2) [] has, [] has not paid or agreed to pay to any person or company employed or retained to solicit or obtain this contract any commission, percentage, brokerage, or other fee contingent upon or resulting from the award of this contract.
- (c) If the answer to either (a)(1) or (a)(2) above is affirmative, the bidder shall make an immediate and full written disclosure to the PHA/IHA Contracting Officer.
- (d) Any misrepresentation by the bidder shall give the PHA/IHA the right to (1) terminate the contract; (2) at its discretion, deduct from contract payments the amount of any commission, percentage, brokerage, or other contingent fee; or (3) take other remedy pursuant to the contract.
- 3. Certification and Disclosure Regarding Payments to Influence Certain Federal Transactions (applicable to contracts exceeding \$100,000)
- (a) The definitions and prohibitions contained in Section 1352 of title 31, United States Code, are hereby incorporated by reference in paragraph (b) of this certification.

- (b) The bidder, by signing its bid, hereby certifies to the best of his or her knowledge and belief as of December 23, 1989 that:
- (1) No Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress on his or her behalf in connection with the awarding of a contract resulting from this solicitation;
- (2) If any funds other than Federal appropriated funds (including profit or fee received under a covered Federal transaction) have been paid, or will be paid, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress on his or her behalf in connection with this solicitation, the bidder shall complete and submit, with its bid, OMB standard form LLL, "Disclosure of Lobbying Activities;" and
- (3) He or she will include the language of this certification in all subcontracts at any tier and require that all recipients of subcontract awards in excess of \$100,000 shall certify and disclose accordingly.
- (c) Submission of this certification and disclosure is a prerequisite for making or entering into this contract imposed by section 1352, title 31, United States Code. Any person who makes an expenditure prohibited under this provision or who fails to file or amend the disclosure form to be filed or amended by this provision, shall be subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$10,000, and not more than \$100,000, for each such failure.
- (d) Indian tribes (except those chartered by States) and Indian organizations as defined in section 4 of the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (25 U.S.C. 450B) are exempt from the requirements of this provision.

4. Organizational Conflicts of Interest Certification

The bidder certifies that to the best of its knowledge and belief and except as otherwise disclosed, he or she does not have any organizational conflict of interest which is defined as a situation in which the nature of work to be performed under this proposed contract and the bidder's organizational, financial, contractual, or other interests may, without some restriction on future activities:

- (a) Result in an unfair competitive advantage to the bidder; or,
- (b) Impair the bidder's objectivity in performing the contract work.
- [] In the absence of any actual or apparent conflict, I hereby certify that to the best of my knowledge and belief, no actual or apparent conflict of interest exists with regard to my possible performance of this procurement.

5. Bidder's Certification of Eligibility

- (a) By the submission of this bid, the bidder certifies that to the best of its knowledge and belief, neither it, nor any person or firm which has an interest in the bidder's firm, nor any of the bidder's subcontractors, is ineligible to:
- (1) Be awarded contracts by any agency of the United States Government, HUD, or the State in which this contract is to be performed; or,
 - (2) Participate in HUD programs pursuant to 24 CFR Part 24.
- (b) The certification in paragraph (a) above is a material representation of fact upon which reliance was placed when making award. If it is later determined that the bidder knowingly rendered an erroneous certification, the contract may be terminated for default, and the bidder may be debarred or suspended from participation in HUD programs and other Federal contract programs.

6. Minimum Bid Acceptance Period

- (a) "Acceptance period," as used in this provision, means the number of calendar days available to the PHA/IHA for awarding a contract from the date specified in this solicitation for receipt of bids.
- (b) This provision supersedes any language pertaining to the acceptance period that may appear elsewhere in this solicitation.
- (c) The PHA/IHA requires a minimum acceptance period of [Contracting Officer insert time period] calendar days.
- (d) In the space provided immediately below, bidders may specify a longer acceptance period than the PHA's/IHA's minimum requirement. The bidder allows the following acceptance period: calendar days.
- (e) A bid allowing less than the PHA's/IHA's minimum acceptance period will be rejected.
- (f) The bidder agrees to execute all that it has undertaken to do, in compliance with its bid, if that bid is accepted in writing within (1) the acceptance period stated in paragraph (c) above or (2) any longer acceptance period stated in paragraph (d) above.

7. Small, Minority, Women-Owned Business Concern Representation

TABLE 5.1 MANDATORY CONTRACT CLAUSES FOR SMALL PURCHASES OTHER THAN CONSTRUCTION

The following contract clauses are required in contracts pursuant to 24 CFR 85.36(i) and Section 6002 of the Solid Waste Disposal Act, as amended by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act. HUD is permitted to require changes, remedies, changed conditions, access and records retention, suspension of work, and other clauses approved by the Office of Federal Procurement Policy. The PHA and contractor is also subject to other Federal laws including the U.S. Housing Act of 1937, as amended, Federal regulations, and state law and regulations.

Examination and Retention of Contractor's Records. The PHA, HUD, or Comptroller General of the United States, or any of their duly authorized representatives shall, until three years after final payment under this contract, have access to and the right to examine any of the Contractor's directly pertinent books, documents, papers, or other records involving transactions related to this contract for the purpose of making audit, examination, excerpts, and transcriptions.

Right in Data and Patent Rights (Ownership and Proprietary Interest). The PHA shall have exclusive ownership of, all proprietary interest in, and the right to full and exclusive possession of all information, materials, and documents discovered or produced by Contractor pursuant to the terms of this Contract, including, but not limited to, reports, memoranda or letters concerning the research and reporting tasks of the Contract.

Energy Efficiency. The Contractor shall comply with all mandatory standards and policies relating to energy efficiency which are contained in the energy conservation plan issued in compliance with the Energy Policy and Conservation Act (Pub.L. 94-163) for the State in which the work under this contract is performed.

Procurement of Recovered Materials

- (a) In accordance with Section 6002 of the Solid Waste Disposal Act, as amended by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, the Contractor shall procure items designated in guidelines of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) at 40 CFR Part 247 that contain the highest percentage of recovered materials practicable, consistent with maintaining a satisfactory level of competition. The Contractor shall procure items designated in the EPA guidelines that contain the highest percentage of recovered materials practicable unless the Contractor determines that such items: (1) are not reasonably available in a reasonable period of time; (2) fail to meet reasonable performance standards, which shall be determined on the basis of the guidelines of the National Institute of Standards and Technology, if applicable to the item; or (3) are only available at an unreasonable price.
- (b) Paragraph (a) of this clause shall apply to items purchased under this contract where: (1) the Contractor purchases in excess of \$10,000 of the item under this contract; or (2) during the preceding Federal fiscal year, the Contractor: (i) purchased any amount of the items for use under a contract that was funded with Federal appropriations and was with a Federal agency or a State agency or agency of a political subdivision of a State; and (ii) purchased a total of in excess of \$10,000 of the item both under and outside that contract.

Termination for Cause and for Convenience (contracts of \$10,000 or more).

- (a) The PHA may terminate this contract in whole, or from time to time in part, for the PHA's convenience or the failure of the Contractor to fulfill the contract obligations (cause/default). The PHA shall terminate by delivering to the Contractor a written Notice of Termination specifying the nature, extent, and effective date of the termination. Upon receipt of the notice, the Contractor shall: (1) immediately discontinue all services affected (unless the notice directs otherwise), and (2) deliver to the PHA all information, reports, papers, and other materials accumulated or generated in performing the contract, whether completed or in process.
- (b) If the termination is for the convenience of the PHA, the PHA shall be liable only for payment for services rendered before the effective date of the termination.
- (c) If the termination is due to the failure of the Contractor to fulfill its obligations under the contract (cause/default), the PHA may (1) require the Contractor to deliver to it, in the manner and to the extent directed by the PHA, any work described in the Notice of Termination; (2) take over the work and prosecute the same to completion by contract of otherwise, and the Contractor shall be liable for any additional cost incurred by the PHA; and (3) withhold any payments to the Contractor, for the purpose of set-off or partial payment, as the case may be, of amounts owned by the PHA by the Contractor. In the event of termination for cause/default, the PHA shall be liable to the Contractor for reasonable costs incurred by the Contractor before the effective date of the termination. Any dispute shall be decided by the Contracting Officer.

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Contractor's Summary Guide to Section 3 Compliance

The purpose of Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968 as amended (12 U.S.C. 1701u) (section 3), and 24 CFR Part 135, is to ensure that training, employment and other economic opportunities generated by certain HUD financial assistance shall, to the greatest extent feasible, and consistent with existing federal, state and local laws and regulations, be directed to low- and very low-income persons, particularly those who are recipients of government assistance for housing, and to business concerns, which provide economic opportunities to low- and very low-income persons." Oakland Housing Authority's Section 3 Economic Opportunities Policy (included in bid documents)
Oakland has one of the highest unemployment rates in the Bay Area. Oakland Housing Authority (OHA)
residents make up over 10% of Oakland's population. OHA developed its Economic Opportunities Policy
(EOP) to comply with the Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Section 3 regulations and ensure that, to the
greatest extent feasible, economic opportunities are provided to low- and very low-income persons and to
Section 3 business concerns within the city of Oakland. All contractors undertaking Section 3 covered projects
and activities on behalf of OHA are expected, to the greatest extent feasible, to meet the numerical goals set
forth below. The policy does not apply to contractors who furnish only materials or supplies and do not
undertake installation of materials or supplies. The EOP is also available from OHA's website
www.oakha.org/procurement/sec3EcoOpportPolicy.pdf.

Section 3 Requirement for All Bidders

As part of the application or bidding process, a Section 3 Business Preference and Action Plan are included in bid documents. Contractors have the option to request Certification as a Section 3 business; however, every proposer **MUST** complete the Action Plan and submit it with their bid, even if no hires are projected.

<u>Certification for Business Seeking Section 3 Business Preference form</u>: Everyone must complete the top portion (check one box, name of business etc.) and sign at the bottom. Fill in the other parts ONLY if you are claiming Section 3 business status.

Action Plan (3 pages): Everyone must complete the top portion listing your company etc., where applicable, and sign every page. If you **do not** anticipate new hires, note that in the table on page 1 and 3. If you **do** anticipate new hires, then use page 1 to detail the job categories and page 3 to describe how you will fill those positions.

Section 3 Requirements for Awardees

Baseline Reporting and Hiring Projections Form

Prior to the Notice to Proceed, the contractor/subcontractor will be responsible for documenting the current workforce (baseline) and providing more accurate hiring projections per job classification than those described in the Action Plan. The Plan that is approved will become part of the contractual agreements.

Hiring Goals

The Section 3 requirement is triggered when there is a need for **new** economic opportunities, such as individual employment, contracting, or subcontracting. The regulation requires that contractors and subcontractors provide, **to the greatest extent feasible**, economic opportunities (training, employment, and contracting) to low and very-low income residents Section 3 businesses.

Contractors and subcontractors are required to make every effort to the greatest extent feasible to meet the OHA's numerical hiring goals of having Section 3 qualified employees make up 30% of their total new-hires. Firms must seek to maintain this percentage throughout the life of the project. If these goals are not met, the contractors are expected to show documentation demonstrating their efforts to hire Section 3 candidates by exhausting all available hiring sources. While a contractor receives credit for hiring low-income residents of Oakland, first priority should be given to residents of the Oakland Housing Authority. This includes residents in both the public housing and Section 8 programs.

Hiring Priorities

First priority (OHA residents):

Residents of the development where the work is being performed

Second priority (OHA residents): Other residents of Oakland Housing Authority owned or managed properties
Third priority (Oakland residents): Other residents within the city of Oakland that meet the low-income

requirements (see definition of Section 3 Resident below).

Resident Referral Process

OHA is committed to working with general contractors and subcontractors to help them reach their Section 3 goals. Therefore, we have established a pre-screening and referral process to identify qualified OHA residents who satisfy the first and second hiring priorities (above). This process ensures that each candidate is in good standing with the housing authority and has a background that qualifies him/her to perform the essential functions of the job.

To ensure the best possible match, it is important that contractors communicate their hiring needs to OHA well in advance of the project start date. We request at least 2 business days' notice before the employee's start date, but earlier notice is preferred. We will work with you to identify a pool of candidates for each position. If we cannot provide you with a candidate, we will grant you a waiver to document your efforts to meet the Section 3 goals.

Union Contractors: OHA's Family and Community Partnerships department (FCP) has established a list of current OHA residents in construction trade unions that is sent to contractors on a regular basis. If there is no candidate that meets your hiring needs, you are encouraged to consider sponsoring an OHA resident who is not a member of a trade union to meet your Section 3 hiring goals.

New Hire Section 3 Information Form

General contractors and subcontractors will be provided this form upon award. Every **new hire** should be requested to complete the form. The form provides the means to determine Section 3 eligibility of the employee. The forms should be submitted to OHA as soon as possible after hiring for verification of Section 3 status.

Monthly Reports

OHA requires monthly reports listing all new hires and Section 3 hires from all contractors and subcontractors on Section 3 covered projects. A sample report will be provided. Reports shall be due on the fifth day of each month for the preceding month. These reports shall be submitted to:

Record Maintenance and Documentation

All projects and activities that are subject to Section 3 requirements shall maintain comprehensive documentation of their Section 3 outreach efforts and implementation activities. Section 3 documentation files should be clearly maintained and be available for review by Oakland Housing Authority and/or HUD officials.

Compliance Reviews

OHA staff will conduct regular compliance reviews, which consist of comprehensive analysis and evaluation of the contractor's compliance with Section 3. Where noncompliance is found, OHA will notify the contractor of the deficiency and make recommendations for corrective actions.

Useful Definitions

Business Concern

A business entity formed in accordance with state law, and which is licensed under state, county or municipal law to engage in the type of business activity for which it was formed.

"Greatest Extent Feasible"

Recipients of Section 3 financial assistance must make every effort within their disposal to meet the regulatory requirements. For instance, this may mean going a step beyond normal notification procedures for employment and contracting opportunities by developing strategies that will specifically target Section 3 residents and businesses for these new economic opportunities.

Household Income Levels

Low and very-low income limits are determined annually by HUD. These limits are typically established at 80 percent and 50 percent of the median income for each locality by household size or number of people residing in one house. HUD income limits can be obtained from www.huduser.org/portal/datasets/il.html.

New Hire

A new hire means a full-time employee for a new permanent, temporary, or seasonal position that is created as a direct result of the expenditure of federal funds on Section 3 covered projects. Any employee that is not on the payroll of a contractor or developer on the day [i.e., that a purchase order is issued or the day a contract is signed or agreed upon] that the Section 3 covered assistance was provided, is considered a new hire.

Section 3 Business Concern

A business concern that meets one or more of the following requirements:

- 51% or more owned by Section 3 residents
- 30% or more of permanent, full-time workforce consists of Section 3 residents
- Provides evidence to subcontract at least 25% of the dollar awarded to qualified Section 3 businesses

Section 3 Resident

- (1) An Oakland Housing Authority public housing resident or Section 8 voucher holder; or
- (2) An individual who resides in the service area (Oakland) in which the Section 3 covered assistance is expended, and whose income status is as follows:

SECTION 3 CLAUSE (24 CFR 135.38)

Authority will not treat Contractor as an employee with respect to the contract services for any purpose, including federal and state tax purposes. Contractor understands and agrees that it is Contractor's responsibility to pay all taxes required by law, including self-employment social security tax. Authority will issue an IRS 1099 Form, or other appropriate tax reporting document, to Contractor for the Contract services.
- C. <u>Benefits</u>. Contractor will not be eligible for, and will not participate in, any health, pension, or other benefit of Authority which exists solely for the benefit of Authority employees during the Contract Term.

4. NO PERSONAL LIABILITY

No member, official or employee of the Authority shall be liable personally to Contractor or any successor in interest in the event of any default or breach by the Authority or for any amount which may become due to Contractor or any successor or on any obligation under the terms of this Contract.

5. <u>ASSIGNMENT OF CONTRACT</u>

Contractor shall not assign this Contract, or any part thereof, without the prior express written consent of the Authority.

6. STANDARD OF PERFORMANCE

The work provided hereunder shall be performed and completed in an accurate and professional manner. All services shall be performed in the manner and according

to the standards observed by the competent practitioner of the profession in which Contractor and any subcontractors are engaged.

7. HUD REQUIREMENTS

Contractor agrees to comply with all relevant HUD requirements, including those set forth in the General Conditions for Non-Construction Contracts, form HUD-5370-C (01/2014), attached hereto as Exhibit C and incorporated as if fully set forth herein. In the event of a conflict between the provisions in the body of this Contract and Exhibit C, the provisions set forth in Exhibit C shall prevail.

8. INDEMNIFICATION

Contractor shall defend, hold harmless and indemnify the Authority, and its respective commissioners, members, officers, agents and employees of and from all claims, loss, damage, injury, actions, causes of action and liability of every kind, nature and description directly or indirectly arising out of or connected with the performance of this Contract and any of Contractor's operations or activities related thereto, excluding the willful misconduct or the gross negligence of the person or entity seeking to be defended, indemnified or held harmless.

9. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

Contractor hereby declares that it is engaged in an independent business and agrees to perform its services as an independent contractor and not as the agent or employee of the Authority. Contractor has and hereby retains the right to exercise full control and supervision of the services and work to be provided under this Contract and full control over the employment, direction, compensation and discharge of all persons assisting it in the performance of the services and work hereunder. Contractor agrees to be solely responsible for all matters relating to payment of employees, including, but not limited to, compliance with all federal, state and local payroll tax and withholding requirements, workers' compensation requirements and all regulations governing such matters. Contractor agrees to be solely responsible for its own acts and those of its subordinates and employees during the term of this Contract.

10. <u>INSURANCE</u>

A. Contractor must procure and maintain for the duration of the Contract, including any extensions, insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work under this Contract by the Contractor, its agents, representatives, employees or subcontractors.

- B. <u>Minimum Scope of Insurance</u>. Coverage must be at least as broad as:
 - (1) Insurance Services Office Commercial General Liability coverage (occurrence form CG 00 01).
 - (2) Insurance Services Office form number CA 00 01 covering Automobile Liability, code 1 (any auto).
 - (3) Workers' Compensation insurance as required by the State of California and Employers Liability Insurance.
 - (4) Errors and Omissions Liability Insurance appropriate to the Contractor's profession covering all negligent acts, error and omissions. Architects' and Engineers' insurance is to be endorsed to include contractual liability.
 - (5) Fidelity Bond appropriate to the on/off site personnel coverage is to be endorsed to include indemnification for misconduct and dishonesty of contractors/ consultants personnel.
 - (6) Cyber Security Insurance coverage is to be endorsed to include indemnification from breach of contract and unauthorized client data access.
- C. <u>Minimum Limits of Insurance</u>. Contractor must maintain limits no less than:
 - (1) General Liability: One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage. If Commercial General Liability Insurance or other form with a general aggregate limit is used, either the general aggregate limit must apply separately to this project/location or the general aggregate limit must be twice the required occurrence limit.
 - (2) <u>Automobile Liability</u>: One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage.
 - (3) Workers' Compensation and Employers Liability: Workers' Compensation limits as required by the State of California and Employer's Liability limits of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) for bodily injury by accident and One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per person and in the annual aggregate for bodily injury by disease. (Required only if Contractor has employees.)

- (4) <u>Professional Liability Insurance</u>: One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence.
- (5) <u>Cyber Insurance:</u> One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence to cover both 1st and 3rd party claims through the entire contract; \$200 per record per occurrence in the amount not to exceed the cost of the full contract.
- (6) <u>Builders Risk Insurance</u>: One Million (\$1,000,000) per occurrence for direct physical property damage.
- D. <u>Deductibles and Self-Insured Retentions</u>. Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the Authority. At the option of the Authority, either: 1) the insurer shall reduce or eliminate such deductibles or self-insured retentions as respects the Authority, and its respective commissioners, members, officers, agents and employees; or 2) Contractor shall provide a financial guarantee satisfactory to the Authority guaranteeing payment of losses and related investigations, claim administration and defense expenses.
- E. <u>Other Insurance Provisions</u>. The general liability and automobile liability policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:
 - (1) The Authority and its respective commissioners, members, officers, agents and employees are to be covered as insureds as respects: liability arising out of automobiles owned, leased, hired or borrowed by or on behalf of the Contractor; and liability arising out of work or operations performed by or on behalf of the Contractor.
 - (2) For any claims related to this Contract, the Contractor's insurance coverage must be primary insurance as respects to the Authority, and its respective commissioners, members, officers, agents, and employees. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the Authority, and its respective commissioners, members, officers, agents or employees shall be excess of Contractor's insurance and shall not contribute with it.
 - (3) Any failure to comply with reporting provisions of the policies shall not affect coverage provided to the Authority and its respective commissioners, members, officers, agents or employees.

- (4) Each insurance policy required by this clause must be endorsed to state that coverage will not be suspended, voided, canceled by either party, or reduced in coverage or in limits, except after thirty (30) days' prior written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, has been given to the Authority.
- F. <u>Workers' Compensation and Employers Liability Coverage</u>. Insurer shall agree to waive all rights of subrogation against the Authority and its respective commissioners, members, officers, agents and employees for losses arising from work performed by Contractor or for the Authority.
- G. <u>Claims Made Coverage</u>. If General Liability and/or Errors and Omissions coverages are written on a claims-made form:
 - i. The "Retro Date" must be shown, and must be before the date of the Contract or the beginning of Contract work.
 - ii. Insurance must be maintained and evidence of insurance must be provided for at least five (5) years after completion of the Contract work.
 - iii. If coverage is canceled or non-renewed, and not replaced with another claims-made policy form with a "Retro Date" prior to the contract effective date, the Contractor must purchase "extended reporting" coverage for a minimum of five (5) years after completion of Contract work.

A copy of the claims reporting requirements must be submitted to OHA for review.

- H. <u>Acceptability of Insurers</u>. Insurance is to be placed with insurers with a current A.M. Best's rating of no less than A:VI.
- I. <u>Verification of Coverage</u>. Contractor must furnish the Authority with certificates of insurance and with original endorsements evidencing coverage required by this clause. The certificates and endorsements for each insurance policy are to be signed by a person authorized by that insurer to bind coverage on its behalf. The certificates and endorsement may be on forms provided by the Authority. All certificates and endorsements are to be received and approved by the Authority before work commences. The Authority reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies, including endorsements demonstrating the coverage required by these specifications at any time.
- J. <u>Subcontractors</u>. Contractor shall include all subcontractors as insureds under its policies or shall furnish separate certificates and endorsements for each subcontractor. All coverages for subcontractors shall be subject to all the requirements stated herein.

11. RECORDS, REPORTS AND AUDITS

A. Records

- (1) Records shall be established and maintained in accordance with Authority requirements, and U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") requirements with respect to all matters covered by this Contract. Except as otherwise authorized by the Authority, such records shall be maintained for a period of four (4) years from the date of the termination of the Contract; except that records that are the subject of audit findings shall be retained for four (4) years or until such audit findings have been resolved, whichever is later.
- (2) All costs shall be supported by properly executed payrolls, time records, invoices, contracts, vouchers or other official documentation evidencing in proper detail the nature and propriety of the charges. All checks, payrolls, invoices, contracts, vouchers, orders or other accounting documents pertaining in whole or in part to this Contract shall be clearly identified and readily accessible.
- B. Reports and Information. At such times and in such forms as the Authority may require, there shall be furnished to the Authority or its designated representative such statements, records, reports, data and information as the Authority may request pertaining to matters covered by this Contract.

12. <u>CONFLICTS</u>

No employee, agent, contractor, officer or official of the Authority who exercises any functions or responsibilities with respect to this Contract or who is in a position to participate in a decision-making process or gain inside information with regard to it, shall obtain a personal or financial interest in or benefit from any contract, subcontract or agreement with respect thereto, or the proceeds thereunder, either for himself or herself or for those with whom they have family or business ties, during his or her tenure or for one (1) year thereafter. The term "contractor" also includes the employees, officers (including board members), agents and subcontractors of a Contractor under this Contract. In order to carry out the purposes of this section, Contractor shall incorporate, or cause to be incorporated, in all contracts and subcontracts relating to activities pursuant to this Contract, a provision similar to that of this section.

13. CONFIDENTIALITY/PROPERTY OF AUTHORITY

All of the reports, information, data or other materials prepared or assembled by Contractor under this Contract, including Contractor's opinions and conclusions based upon such items, are confidential. Contractor agrees that such reports, information,

opinions or conclusions shall not be made available to or discussed with any individual or organization, including the news media, without the prior written approval of the Authority. Unless otherwise stated in the Scope of Services, all such reports, information, data or other materials and work product shall become the property of the Authority.

14. <u>COMPLIANCE WITH CALIFORNIA GOVERNMENT CODE</u>

It is understood and agreed that Contractor shall comply with California Government Code Section 7550. Government Code Section 7550 provides in part that when the total cost for work performed for a local Authority by nonemployees of such Authority exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000), any document or written report prepared in whole or in part by nonemployees for such Authority shall contain, in a separate section, the numbers and dollar amount of all contracts and subcontracts relating to the preparation of such document or written report.

15. NONDISCRIMINATION, EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY AND MINORITY AND WOMAN-OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES

- A. There shall be no discrimination against or segregation of any person, or group of persons, on account of race, color, religion, creed, national origin or ancestry, sex, gender identity, age, marital or domestic partner status, sexual orientation or disability (including HIV or AIDS status) in the performance of this Contract. Contractor will ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, religion, creed, national origin or ancestry, sex, gender identity, age, marital or domestic partner status, sexual orientation or disability (including HIV or AIDS status). - B. Contractor will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by it or on its behalf, state it is an equal opportunity employer.
- C. Contractor will cause the foregoing provisions to be inserted in all subcontracts for any work covered by this Contract so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor, provided that the foregoing provisions shall not apply to contracts or subcontracts for standard commercial supplies or raw materials.
- D. Contractor shall provide all services to the public under this Contract in facilities that are accessible to persons with disabilities as required by state and federal law.

16. TERMINATION

Authority may, by written notice, at any time prior to the completion of the term, terminate this Contract for any reason, including, but not limited to, convenience of Authority, default by the Contractor, or circumstances beyond the control of the Contractor. In the event of such termination, Authority shall compensate the Contractor for work completed to the satisfaction of Authority as of the date of such notice or the date of termination specified in and directed by such notice. Upon payment of the amount due, Authority shall be under no further obligation to the Attorney, financial or otherwise.

17. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

A. <u>Notices</u>. All notices, demands, consents, or approvals required under this Contract shall be in writing and shall be deemed given when delivered personally or by facsimile transmission or three (3) business days after being deposited in the U.S. Mail, first class postage prepaid, return receipt requested, addressed as follows:

B. <u>Time of Performance</u>

- (1) Time is of the essence in the performance of all the terms and conditions of this Contract.
- (2) All performance and cure periods expire at 5:00 p.m., Oakland, California, time, on the applicable date.
- (3) A performance or cure date which otherwise would be a Saturday, Sunday or Authority holiday shall be extended to the next Authority working day.
- C. <u>Successors and Assigns</u>. This Contract shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the successors and assigns of the Authority and the Contractor. Where the term "Contractor" or "Authority" is used in this Contract, it shall mean and include their respective successors and assigns; <u>provided</u>, <u>however</u>, that the Authority shall have no obligation under this Contract to, nor shall any benefit of this Contract

accrue to, any unapproved successor or assign of Contractor where Authority approval of a successor or assign is required by this Contract.

- D. <u>Modification, Waiver and Amendment</u>. Any modification, waiver or amendment of any of the provisions of this Contract must be in writing and signed by both the Authority and Contractor.
- E. <u>Entire Contract</u>. This Contract represents the complete agreement between the parties as to the matters described herein, and there are no oral understandings between Contractor and the Authority affecting this Contract not set forth herein. This Contract supersedes all previous negotiations, arrangements, agreements and understandings between Contractor and the Authority with respect to the subject matter hereof.
- F. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Contract shall be determined to be illegal or unenforceable, such determination shall not affect any other provision and all such other provisions shall remain in full force and effect.
- G. <u>Governing Law</u>. This Contract shall be governed by the laws of the State of California. It is the responsibility of Contractor to be informed of local, state and federal laws and requirements applicable to this Contract and to perform all work in compliance with those laws and requirements.
- H. <u>Headings</u>. Titles of parts or sections of this Contract are inserted for convenience only and shall be disregarded in construing or interpreting its provisions.
- I. Attorneys' Fees. In any action or proceeding arising out of this Contract, the prevailing party shall be entitled to reasonable attorneys' fees and costs.
- J. <u>Authority</u>. The undersigned represents and warrants that he or she has full power and authority to enter into this Contract and to bind the Contractor in accordance with its terms.

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VENDOR PROTESTS AND CLAIMS PROCEDURES

The following are the definitions of terms used in this section.

Who May Submit A Protest or Claim:

Any person or entity that meets the definition of vendor as referenced above may submit a protest or claim.

This procedure applies to bidding procedures for amounts above the 'Small Purchase' threshold (> \$100,000). For Small Purchases (\$2,000 - \$100,000), all complaints, protests, or claims will be referred to the Deputy Executive Director for resolution.

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Vendor protests, claims, or disputes shall be resolved using the following procedures:

A. Protests After the Bid, Quote, or Proposal Opening, but Prior to Award of Contract:

1. Any protest or claim must be submitted in writing by the vendor on the <u>Notice of Protest or Claim form</u>. The form, along with any supporting documents, must be sent by certified, registered or overnight mail or delivered by a reputable delivery service with a delivery receipt to the following address:

2. *Under the Competitive (Sealed) Bids Process:* Vendor must submit a written Notice of Protest or Claim to the Authority's Contracting Officer within *five business days* of the *bid opening date*.

Under the RFPs (Request for Proposals) Process: For RFPs where there is no bid opening, Vendor must submit a written Notice of Protest or Claim to the Authority's Contracting Officer within *five business days* of the date on which the name of the Contractor has been released after the completion of the evaluation process or the "Posted Website Date". The 'Posted Website Date' is the date that CCGS will post the selected Contractor as a result of the evaluation panel member decision. Please note that the selection of the final Contractor is contingent upon final board approval (if applicable) and/or all required documents have been received.

- 3. All protests or claims must contain, at a minimum, the following to be considered valid:
 - The Name(s), address(es), telephone and fax number(s), email address(es) and title(s) of the person(s) filing the protest or claims;
 - The name of the company and the address, telephone and fax number(s) and email addresses thereof (if different from above);
 - The title and number of the solicitation (i.e., bid, proposal and quotation);
 - The signature of the vendor or agent representing the vendor;
 - A detailed description of the grounds for the protest or claim, and identification of the specific statutory or regulatory provision(s) that the OHA contracting personnel or other relevant employees allegedly have violated;
 - A detailed statement of all the relevant fact (including how the vendor was aggrieved or prejudiced against) with any supporting documentation; and,
 - The type of relief and redress the vendor is seeking.
- 4. Immediately upon receipt of the vendor's notice, the Contracting Officer shall send the vendor an acknowledgement for receipt of the Notice. The Oakland Housing Authority acknowledgement shall indicate if the Notice was filed within the required time period. A late notice is not eligible for consideration under this procedure and will be rejected

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- 5. The vendor's protest, along with the tabulation sheet, scope of work of the solicitation, copies of responses received, and any other relevant documents, shall be provided to the Contracting Officer. The Contracting Officer shall review the vendor's protest and the circumstances and prepare a "Finding of Fact."
- 6. Based upon the "Finding of Fact", the Contracting Officer may take any of the following actions or any other actions deemed to be appropriate and within the scope of statutory and regulatory requirements.
 - (a) Determine that the protest is invalid.
 - (b) Reject all responses to the solicitation.
 - (c) Cancel or revise the solicitation.

The decision of the Contracting Officer shall be final.

B. Special Circumstances:

<u>Board Approval</u>: If the dollar amount of the lowest responsive, responsible bidder is above the amount threshold requiring approval by the Board of Commissioners, the Contracting Officer shall make a recommendation of action to the Board ratifying this finding.

C. OHA Recordkeeping Requirement:

OHA shall maintain a complete and detailed record of all protests and claims. The record shall include all pertinent correspondence, the written or recorded minutes of any meetings with the vendors making the protests or claims, and any information used in determining OHA's actions in the disposition of protests or claims.

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NOTICE OF PROTEST OR CLAIM
