The Department of Family and Community Partnerships (FCP) was formed in 2010 to consolidate OHA's existing and newly initiated resident programs and partnerships. The programs improve opportunities and outcomes for families in the Public Housing and Section 8 programs and support a path to self-sufficiency.

Consistent with OHA's mission, FCP is focused on meeting four primary goals:
